Edward Baird (USA) and Minoru Hirano (Japan) will work with pitch and registration and Thomas Cleveland (USA) and otolaryngologist, Anthony Jahn will demonstrate visual feedback in teaching through the use of the fiberoptic scope.

Rudolf Knoll (Austria) will talk on Mozart Arias: Technique and Style and Julianne Baird (USA) will lead a discussion on Baroque Ornamentation.

Horst Günter (Germany) will talk about *Hearing and Imagination in Voice Building*, Pearl Wormhoudt (USA) will present a session entitled, *On the Psychology of Singing and Teaching of Singing*. Robert McFerrin (USA) will do a special session for voice teachers.

Recitals
